

# THE MURANG'A COUNTY FINANCE BILL 2023

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# MURANG'A COUNTY FINANCE BILL, 2023

**AN ACT of the County Assembly of Murang'a to provide for the revenue raising measures and the imposition or variation of various taxes, fees, charges, licences, rents or rates for services and for connected purposes**

**ENACTED** by the County Assembly of Murang'a as follows:

## **PART I—PRELIMINARY**

### **Short Title and Commencement**

1. This Bill may be cited as the Murang'a County Finance Bill, 2023 and shall come into operation on the date of publication in the Kenya Gazette.

### **Interpretation**

2. (1) In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires—

“agricultural rental rate” means a rate charged on agricultural land based on value or acreage;

“Authorized channel” means the manner in which a person may effect payment to the County, including but not limited to a person designated by the Executive Committee Member pursuant to Section 157 of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012, to collect or receive revenue or any other mode of payment as may be prescribed from time to time;

“business” means -

- a) trade, commerce; manufacture, profession, vocation or occupation;
- b) any other activity in the nature of trade, commerce or manufacture, profession, vocation or occupation;
- c) any activity carried on by a person continuously or regularly, whether or not for gain or profit and which involves, in part or in whole, the supply of goods or services for consideration;

“County” means the County Government of Murang'a;

“County Public Officer” means a County Public Officer within the meaning of Section 2 of the County Governments Act, 2012;

“County Receiver of Revenue” means the persons appointed pursuant to Section 157 of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012; or any other person appointed by the County Public Service Board to be the head/ director of revenue;

“County Revenue Collector” means the county public officer appointed pursuant to Section 158 of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012;

“Executive Committee Member” means the executive committee member for the time being responsible for matters relating to finance in the county;

“Cess” means all taxes and or levies imposed under this Act and payable to the Murang’a County Government;

“fees” means payments made to the relevant county department in exchange for services rendered;

“hawk” means, whether as principal agent or employee – trade by the sale or exchange of goods, wares; merchandise, refreshments, by moving along streets or public places or from premises to premises;

“hawker” means and includes any person who as principal, agent or employee carries on the business of offering or exposing goods for sale, barter or exchange by hawking and without placing them in any designated market place;

“licence” means the permits granted by the relevant county department to carry on trade under this Act or any other written law; “nganangu” means kikuyu basket handles;

“njugu” means kikuyu peas;

## **PART II—FEES, CHARGES AND RENT**

### **General Fees and Charges**

3. (1) A person who wishes to carry out the activities specified in the First Schedule shall pay the fees specified in the last column of the relevant Part of that Schedule—

(2) A person who wishes to carry out any of the activities listed under the First Schedule shall apply for a permit to the County.

(3) The County shall grant the relevant permit(s) to the applicant(s) upon payment of fees prescribed in the relevant Part of that Schedule.

(4) A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section commits an offence and is liable, upon conviction to fine of twenty thousand shillings or to imprisonment of a term not exceeding two months or to both.

### **Licence Fees**

4. (1) A person shall not carry out any business or provide the services specified in the Second Schedule without a valid license or permit issued by the County.

(2) A person who intends to carry out any of the businesses listed in the Second Schedule shall apply for a licence or permit from the sub- county office where the business is located or from a designated agent as may be prescribed by the County from time to time.

(3) A person who applies for a licence under subsection (2) shall be issued with a licence upon payment of the fee specified in that Schedule.

(4) A licence or permit issued under subsection (3) shall be visibly displayed at the business premise at all times, failure to display will attract a fine of one thousand shillings.

(5) A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this Section commits an offence and is liable, upon conviction to fine of thirty thousand shillings or to imprisonment of a term not exceeding two months or to both.

### **Market Fees**

5. (1) There shall be a fee for access of markets or stalls for the sale of goods, foods, animals or products as specified in the Second Schedule.

(2) A person who accesses the markets or the stalls for the sale of goods, foods, animals or products shall pay the fees specified in the last column of the Sixth Schedule.

(3) A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section commits an offence.

### **Mining and Transport Cess**

6. (1) A person who receives or carries out the services specified in the Third Schedule shall pay the fee specified in the relevant Part of that Schedule.

(2) A person who contravenes the provisions of this section commits an offence and is liable, upon conviction to fine of thirty thousand shillings or to imprisonment of a term not exceeding two months or to both.

### **Public Health Fees and Charges**

7. (1) A person to receives or carries out the services specified in the Fourth Schedule shall pay the fee specified in the relevant Part of that Schedule.

(2) A person who contravenes the provisions of this section commits an offence.

### **Trade Weights and Measures**

8. (1) A person shall not carry out any business or provide the services that require the use of weights as specified in the Fifth Schedule without a valid license or permit issued by the County.

(2) A person who contravenes any the provisions this Section commits an offence and is liable, upon conviction to fine of thirty thousand shillings or to imprisonment of a term not exceeding two months or to both.

### **Lands, Housing and Physical Planning Fees**

9. (1) The County shall offer the services specified in the Sixth Schedule upon receipt of payment of the fee prescribed in the last column of that Schedule.

(2) A person who constructs a building or structure in the manner specified in the Sixth Schedule shall apply for a construction permit to the County Department responsible for physical planning.

(3) A person who carries out development within the County without the appropriate plan approval shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable for a conviction to a fine not exceeding twenty thousand or an imprisonment term not exceeding one year or both,

(4) A person occupying a land and plot, stall or a building leased or rented out by the County shall pay rent, at the rate specified in the last column of the relevant Part of the Sixth Schedule.

(5)The rent referred to under subsection (4) shall be due in case of—

(a) a plot, on the 1st day of January in each year,

(b) a house or a stall, on the 30th day of each month.

(6)A person who contravenes the provisions of subsections 5(a) or 5(b) may be evicted if he fails to pay the rent for six consecutive months.

(7) A penalty of three percent compounded per month shall be charged on the outstanding rent on a plot that remains unpaid after 31st day of March.

(8)The County may repossess the plot referred to under subsection 4 above if the person fails to pay the rent for more than five consecutive years.

(9) A person who wishes to display advertisements and signage in the manner specified in the Fifth Schedule shall apply for a permit to the county department responsible for physical planning and payment done through county revenue office.

(10) A person who wishes to advertise in the manner specified in the fifth Schedule shall apply for a permit to the County Department responsible for physical planning and payment done through revenue office.

(11) The department may grant the necessary permit referred to under subsection 10 upon payment of fees prescribed in the Schedule to the county revenue office.

(12) A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section commits an offence.

## **Finance and Economic Planning**

**10.** (1) A person who wishes to carry out the activities specified in the Seventh Schedule shall pay the fees specified in the last column of the relevant Part of that Schedule.

(2) A person who wishes to carry out any of the activities listed under the Seventh Schedule shall apply for a permit to the County.

(3) The County shall grant the relevant permit(s) to the applicant(s) upon payment of fees prescribed in the relevant Part of that Schedule.

(4) A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section commits an offence and is liable, upon conviction to fine of thirty thousand shillings or to imprisonment of a term not exceeding two months or to both

## **Parking Fees and Penalties**

**11.** (1) A person who uses county parking shall be charged a fee specified in the Eight Schedule.

(2) There shall be penalties for late payment of parking fees, impounding of vehicles as specified in the Eight Schedule.

## **Hire of County Vehicle and Machinery**

**12.** (1) A person shall not use county machinery without permission from the relevant county authority.

(2) A person who wishes to use a county machine shall apply to the relevant authority within the county government.

(3) The relevant county authority may grant the application under subsection (2) upon payment of the required charges through the county revenue office.

(4) A person who contravenes the provision of this section commits an offence.

## **Alcoholic Drinks and Licenses**

**13.** (1) A person shall not carry out any business or provide the services specified in the Ninth Schedule without a valid license or permit issued by the county.

(2) A person who intends to carry out any of the businesses listed in the Ninth Schedule shall apply for a licence or permit from the sub- county office where the business is located or from a designated agent as may be prescribed by the County from time to time.

(3) A person who applies for a licence under subsection (2) shall be issued with a licence upon payment of the fee specified in that Schedule.

(4) A licence or permit issued under subsection (3) shall be visibly displayed at the business premise at all times, failure to display will attract a fine of five thousand shillings.

(5) A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this Section commits an offence and is liable, upon conviction to fine of thirty thousand shillings or to imprisonment of a term not exceeding two months or to both.

### **Trade Licences**

**14.** (1) A person shall not carry out any business or provide the services specified in the Tenth Schedule without a valid license or permit issued by the county.

(2) A person who intends to carry out any of the businesses listed in the Tenth Schedule shall apply for a licence or permit from the sub- county office where the business is located or from a designated agent as may be prescribed by the County from time to time.

(3) A person who applies for a licence under subsection (2) shall be issued with a licence upon payment of the fee specified in that Schedule.

(4) A licence or permit issued under subsection (3) shall be visibly displayed at the business premise at all times, failure to display will attract a fine of one thousand shillings.

(5) A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this Section commits an offence and is liable, upon conviction to fine of thirty thousand shillings or to imprisonment of a term not exceeding two months or to both.

### **Fire Fighting Services**

**15.**(1) A person shall not carry out any business or provide the services specified in the Second Schedule without a valid license or permit issued by the county.

(2) A person who intends to carry out any of the businesses listed in the Second Schedule shall apply for a licence or permit from the sub- county office where the business is located or from a designated agent as may be prescribed by the County from time to time.

(3) A person who applies for a licence under subsection (2) shall be issued with a licence upon payment of the fee specified in that Schedule.

(4) A licence or permit issued under subsection (3) shall be visibly displayed at the business premise at all times, failure to display will attract a fine of one thousand shillings.

(5) A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section commits an offence and is liable, upon conviction to fine of thirty thousand shillings or to imprisonment of a term not exceeding two months or to both.

## **PART III- MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS**

### **Receiver and collector of revenue**

**16** (1) The Executive Member shall appoint any person as receiver and collector of revenue in accordance to section 157 and 158 of the Public Finance Management Act 2012.

(2) A person shall not receive or collect any money on behalf of the County Government unless he or she has been appointed to do so and therefore have the authority as receiver or collector of revenue.

(3) Any county public officer, other than the receiver or collector of revenue, who collects fees, charges, permit, rent, or any other such fee as may be imposed by the county government shall within three days after receiving it deliver the revenue to county receiver of revenue or collector of revenue.

### **Payments**

**17**(1) All payments to the county government shall be paid through an authorized channel.

(2) A county receipt shall be issued for all payments made under this Act.

(3) County receiver or collector of revenue, enforcement officer, auditor and any other authorized officer may require production of receipt from the customers or members of the public as proof of payments made under this Act.

(4) Any payments due to the county may be paid in advance.

(5) Any person who contravenes this provision will be guilty of an offence and be liable to pay a fine of not less than Kenya shillings twenty thousand or imprisonment of one month or both

### **General Offences and Penalties**

**18.** (1) A person shall not —

- (a) breach or fail to comply with the provisions of this Act;
- (b) breach or fail to comply with any of, the terms or conditions of a license certificate issued to him under this Act;
- (c) fail to comply with a lawful requirement or demand made or given by the Authority or an inspector;
- (d) obstruct a person in the execution of the powers or duties under this Act;
- (e) damages or destroys council property, documents or other item used for revenue collection or enforcement shall be guilty of an offence.
- (f) knowingly or recklessly make a statement or representation which is false;
- (g) knowingly or recklessly furnish a document or information required under this Act which is false; or

- (h) knowingly or recklessly use or furnish a fake or forged or invalid certificate or a certificate that has been altered without authorization.
- (i) collects revenue with receipt books not issued by the county government shall be guilty of an offence.
- (j)

(2) A person who contravenes any of the provisions of subsection (1) commits an offence.

(3) Any person who contravenes any provision of this Act or commits an offence for which there is no penalty prescribed shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding fifty thousand shillings, or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months, or to both.

### **Amendments to the schedules**

**19.** (1) The Executive Committee Member may by order, published in the gazette, make an amendment to any of the Schedules.

(2) This Act shall be amended in the same manner that other Acts are amended.

### **Regulations**

**20.** The County Executive Member for Finance may, with the approval of the County Assembly, make regulations for the better carrying out of the provisions of this Act.

### **Tax Waivers, Variations**

**21.** The Executive Committee Member may exempt, waive or vary fees or charges payable under this Act in accordance to the criteria prescribed in the regulations.

### **Transition**

**22.** Any person who before the commencement of this Act was a holder of a valid license or permit issued under the previous legislations in force shall continue to hold such license until the stipulated time expires.

### **Cessation**

**23.** Unless provided in this Act, the fees, charges, rates, licenses, cess or rent applicable before the commencement of this Act in respect of any business, activity, goods or services listed in the schedule shall cease to apply.
